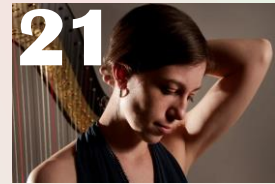

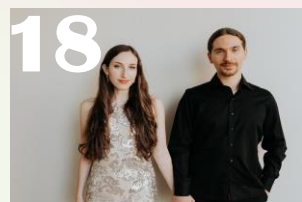

BWV 565, and Franck's *Violin Sonata* arranged for piano four-hands by Cortot.

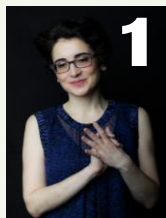
25 Soprano **Heather Fetrow** and pianist **Rebecca Ehren** will present *Voyage à Paris*

22 Violinist **Akiko Kobayashi** will be presenting an unaccompanied solo violin program from the early to the High Baroque including Biber, Bach and more.



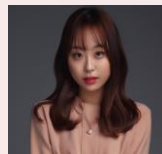
